Learning Objective: The planning process begins by deciding on your instructional objective.	
Anticipatory Set: This is a short, motivating activity that is used to focus your group's attention on a new topic and to help them recall prior knowledge or experience related to the topic.	
Lesson Objectives: The <u>purpose</u> for your planned learning activities is shared with the group.	
Input: This is the time for your presentation and explanation of the main concepts and skills to be developed in the session.	
Check Understanding: You will often use multi-level questioning drawn from Bloom's Taxonomy at this time to help you develop student understanding and adjust your instruction as needed.	
Guided Practice: Here, your students have the opportunity to demonstrate how well they have internalized their understanding of the topic.	
Independent Study: This time is included to help your students solidify skills and knowledge once they have demonstrated their understanding.
